Update: Because of the car donation the Burmeisters have been able to move into an apartment at the Wycliffe Bible Center in West Chicago. Jonathan goes weekly to the hospital for treatments. He anticipates receiving the bone marrow transplant within the next two months. They are still facing heavy monthly expenses for his medications. Long time members at St. John Lutheran, Wheaton, and Wycliffe Bible translator and associate member of Lutheran Bible Translators, Jonathon Burmeister and his wife Nancy have been serving the Lord for the past 36 years in Ivory Coast and Mali, Africa. Many of their furloughs from the mission field were spent in Wheaton where they attended worship, Bible study, and were involved in other activities while members of St. John. Two of their children went through youth confirmation

at St. John.

Jonathon was recently diagnosed with a particularly rare form of anemia and was evacuated from Ivory Coast in December and is being treated at the University of Chicago Hospital. Thankfully, Jonathon will be undergoing a bone marrow transplant in March, with his sister as donor.
