Seeing the Face of Jesus in the Poorest of the Poor

This past week I had the opportunity to return to Haiti after 10 years. I went with volunteers (photo



left) from Illinois, New York, Boston, and Michigan to work with the Lutheran Church of Haiti in the providence of Jeremie. We worked with Pastor Isaac, who is the equivalent of the District President of that area, with 32 churches under his supervision. The trip was organized through Sue and Ken Gross of Christ Lutheran Church in Orland Park. They did a wonderful job of coordinating the Mission crews that went out over the two week period! I also want to thank Rev. S.T. Williams of St Paul Lutheran Church in Los Angeles for

his coordination and commitment over the last 30 years to the work of the Lutheran Church in Haiti.



Listen in on **Thursday**, **July 24th at 5:00 PM** when Rev. Keith GeRue is interviewed on KUFO. Rev. GeRue will be discussing his experience as a Chaplin in Iraq where he began a program to provide stuffed animals to the children visiting their families at the Detention Facility in



Bucca, Iraq. Because of the tremendous response they received from the families as well from the donors the ministry has expanded to include a need for **clothing**, **blankets**, **pens**, **paper**, **crayons and coloring books** as well as the stuffed animals. The camp currently houses 22,000+ detainees, so the need for items is great and ongoing. As Rev. GeRue shared "We are not allowed to initiate a conversation about Christ but we can answer any questions we are asked. The items we give to the families opens the door for the gospel when they ask us why we are doing this."

Rev. GeRue has returned home but he will continue to coordinate this ministry with LCC and be the liaison with the Chaplains currently stationed in Bucca, Iraq.

It has been a tough year for them. Jerry is now in Mount Caramel Nursing Home full time. He is now on Public Aid, meaning the govt. takes his disability salary and pays for the care. There were about 3 months that he did not have the aid and they got about \$12,000.00 in debt. Barb and the kids are living on her 10 month teaching salary from St. John. She has begun to sell Pampered Chef and has her own website www.pamperedchef.biz/barbheimsoth to try to supplement the family income. This is one way people could help them, save gas (products can be ordered on line and shipped directly to the buyer)and get quality kitchenware or gifts. Otherwise donations to their fund would be so much appreciated.

I have to tell you a little story revealing Jerry's character. Jerry has been in a nursing home for about 8 months now. He can't talk - he points to letters on a board that



Barb made. He can't swallow liquids - he now has a feeding tube. He can't attend his little girl's high school activities. He just has so little in the blessings we all take for granted. Barb goes to the nursing home every afternoon to feed him dinner and tuck him in bed. She has been trying very hard to get Jerry moved to a new room with bed by the window. What difference that would make! He has had an interior bed and his roommates enjoy the sun while he sees a curtain and the depressing hallway all day. Barb finally succeeded in getting him moved and he will room with another young (60 ish) man who has become a friend at dinner. Barb was so excited to give Jerry the news. A new room, a window and a roommate who is not over 80!!! What a blessing! The next day Jerry told Barb that he has given the window position to his roommate. Barb said, "Why?? I worked so hard to get the window for you!" He replied, "Kevin really wanted it." Jerry is still ministering in his own way. He is a remarkable man.



The Orphan Grain Train has joined hands with a Bartholomew County United Way agency named Sans Sousi and obtained a large building for the purpose of receiving and distribution of goods to the people in legitimate need. This effort is to avoid duplication of goods, manpower and get a building large enough to handle the volume of items that are needed to help the families with severe losses.

The items that are needed include all types of furniture, dinning, bedroom, living and family room that is in good condition, Also appliances of all kinds, washers, driers .stoves, refrigerators, TV's, VCR's sweepers .freezers and all type of good usable goods. They want to include bedding, tableware, cooking utensils, including plastic kitchen ware, sewing machines, rugs and good clean carpet.

We are planning a three week trip this year, Lord willing, leaving on September 22 and returning on October 15th. In addition to a two-week educational program that will heavily emphasize a study of Lutheran worship as that centers on the saving gifts in Word and the Sacraments, we hope to do some strengthening of congregations in the bush tribal region of Kono as road conditions permit.


