Because of Mildred's generous donation Katie will be back on campus this week. RSD is a lifelong condition and because of it Katie will have continuing medical and equipment needs. Some of Katie's current needs are:

- portable ramps for her wheelchair

- treatment for pain management.

Many of these expenses exceed or are disallowed by her insurance. Here is a young dedicated Christian woman determined to follow her passion to minister to deaf children. 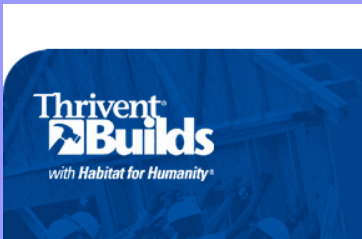

When Crisis Strikes, LCC Volunteers Respond!

Less than 24 hours after sending out an emergency appeal to help Redeemer Lutheran Church, LCC staff along with 24 LCC volunteers arrived in Rockford ready to serve.

On Saturday, August 11, LCC staff worked with more than 77 Lutheran volunteers to assist flood victims living in the Rockford area. Included in these volunteers were those from Lutheran Church Charities, Christ the Rock, in Rockford; Redeemer Lutheran, Rockford; El Redentor, Rockford; Mount Olive, Rockford; St. Paul, Rockford; and San Juan, Elgin. These men and women spent the afternoon cleaning out basements, salvaging household items and discarding destroyed furnishings. Those who were unable to enter the affected homes (containing on average, 3 feet of water) were able to help in many other ways, including serving food to other victims and volunteers, registering teams and sending them to flooded houses, organizing and handing out tools and gloves from the LCC tool trailer, and serving as door-to-door missionaries. Two of the volunteers, Brenda Reyes, a member of Redeemer Lutheran Church, and Bill Duey Jr., a professor at Concordia University in River Forest were featured on the WIFR Rockford news [>>>VIDEO LINK<<](#).

By the end of Saturday, 16 houses had been cleaned out - a successful day for both the victims and the volunteers. However, the physical mending of broken homes was not the most important activity taking place, but rather an open door to share the grace of God, and to let the victims know that they are not alone.

Susan Busse, MD, Medical Mission Liaison for LCC (pictured below) will be joining the medical mission trip to Mexico sponsored by **Pastor Gerald Schalk** (pictured Left) of **St. Matthew Lutheran Church in Barrington Illinois**. The trip dates are October 13-20th. The group will be staying at the dormitory at Ysleta Lutheran Mission in El Paso, Texas and will cross the border each day to work in one of four clinics in Mexico. Much of the medicine which they use is donated. Below is a list of medicines for which they have the greatest demand:

Prescription meds:

- glucophage, actos, or other diabetes meds
- diflucan
- captopril or other BP meds
- ampicillin
- any inhalers
- inderal
- prilosec
- dulcolax
- any antibiotics-especially for respiratory infections
- pediatric meds

Over-the-counter meds:

- advil and the like
- fiber
- vitamins for all ages
- prenatal vitamins
- calcium and calcium with vitamin D
- cold and cough medicines
- pepcid
- pediatric meds

Additional supplies:

- tongue depressors
- blood glucose testing stripes

They plan to pack and ship the medicines and supplies after the team orientation meeting on Sunday, September 16. Supplies can be received up to the 15th.

We had a total of 70 children from the neighborhood enroll in VBS this year. It was a hot week, but we survived and kept cool with fans and staying in the shade. Our mornings included opening in the historic church led by Eric Larson, our DCE who played guitar as we sang the songs from "Quest for Truth - Jesus: the Way, the Truth and the Life." The rest of our morning included Bible Story time, crafts, singing and of course snacks. Maria and the ladies from the Soup Kitchen fed us and all the children each day at Noon. On Tuesday,

we got to help Pastor Loza and St. Matthew's celebrate their 18th year of operating the Soup Kitchen in the Pilsen neighborhood. There was a large crowd for the meal that day, with all 60 kids and many of the homeless and unemployed from the neighborhood present to eat. But Maria and her helper fed us all, with food left over. It truly is a miracle, a "feeding of the 5000," as one of our teachers said. It was an eye opener for all of us!



This is our second year teaching VBS at St. Matthew's. This year it became apparent to us just how little these kids know of the Bible. This truly is a mission field right here in our own Chicago. Our teachers and helpers ranged in age from 14 on up to Mom's and Grandmas. Everyone worked hard, but came away very fulfilled and blessed. This is definitely something that we will make a tradition for us each year. We thank Pastor Loza and St. Matthew's for letting us come and be a blessing to them, because we have been so blessed in being there.

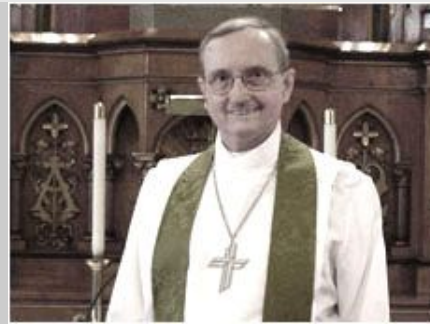

Lutheran Pastor and Family, Hurricane Ivan refugees, seeks immediate assistance to return to Florida

The Rev. Fr. Philip Mullen is an independent Orthodox Lutheran pastor, residing with his family in the rented parsonage of another independent Lutheran congregation. We are assisting Fr. Mullen and Family in fund raising efforts toward their emergency relocation back to Florida.



The Mullen Family (*pictured here*) are refugees from Hurricane Ivan (Pensacola, Florida, September 16, 2004), who have temporarily lived in Columbus, Ohio, since March 10, 2005. They are also an independent Orthodox Lutheran preaching station. The Mullen Family was forced to relocate from Florida due to the City of Pensacola's Eviction Order for Hurricane Damage. They are still recovering after Hurricane Ivan. The Mullen Family's relocation to Columbus was always meant to be temporary, with a return to Florida ever in mind. 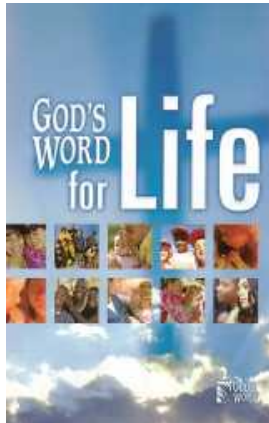
