be received by Monday, Dec 10th.



Family With Severe Medical Problems in Need of Assistance

Request from Pastor Bill Cate, St. Peter Lutheran Church, Schaumburg, Illinois

We are working with a member family that is in need of assistance. They need help with living expenses in general, medical expenses for two members of the family, and the expenses of caring for a totally disabled son. The wife/mother of the family is currently receiving treatment for breast cancer and possibly lymphatic cancer. She has lost her job and is fully disabled at this time. The husband/father has been diagnosed with narcolepsy, so is having difficulty retaining his full-time school bus driving



job, after being laid-off permanently from a tool-and-die career. Their adult son suffers from Cerebral Palsy, is fully disabled and wheel-chair bound with both mental and physical incapacity. The family has three other young children at home as well.

Our local Thrivent chapter will be providing some assistance for the family through Thrivent's "Care Abounds in Communities" program, but their need is great and additional assistance is needed to minister to the family's needs.

Family in Need of Assistance After Serious Car Accident

Request from Pastor Paul Cutler, Grace Lutheran Church, Streamwood, Illinois

Grace Lutheran Church Sunday Kid's Club, Streamwood, IL is asking you to join hands and hearts to help a family in need. A young family of 4 needs our help. Saturday, December 1, 2007 was supposed to be a day of happiness and joy. One of our church families was helping their nephew Jason and his wife and children move into the first home of their own.



However, this joyous day turned into a day of fears and tears. As Jason (Dad) was driving from his new home to pick up more of their belongings, a driver in front of Jason lost control of her car and hit him head on. It took the fire department over 2 hours to cut him out of his car. Jason now lies in the hospital with a shattered left femur, and crushed right ankle and a broken right wrist. He is in traction and in severe pain.



We praise God that He was with him and that He didn't take Jason from us but we are asking for assistance for his family. Jason was the only one in the car, as his wife Cathie was staying home with the little ones Jacob 4 and Demita 7. Jason is looking at a minimum of 6-8 weeks after leaving the hospital, in a rehabilitation center, and the outlook for his being able to walk the same again is questionable. We are praying for assistance for his family's bills and to provide a Christmas for them. Any help would be





We have always loved entertaining. A large part has been cooking with family and friends. There is nothing better than everyone crowded in the kitchen creating a meal.

After visiting Biloxi and New Orleans for Lutheran Church Charities we became very aware of

"Fifth Wheel" Trailer Needed! Elderly Couple in Urgent Need in High Island, TX Rev. Glenn Merritt, LCMS World Relief and Human Care.



An elderly couple from High Island, TX, is requesting help from LCMS World Relief & Human Care. Their connection with the LCMS is through friends who are affiliated with Orphan Grain Train and through people they once knew at congregation in Beaumont, TX. They really have not been connected with the congregation for many years but they know one couple we helped resettle after Hurricane Rita.

Mercy forever. This couple, Jack & Connie, have extensive health issues; Jack having been disabled since the early 60's. They are currently living at the home of their daughter and son-in-law in Splendora, TX in a small, very old camper that formerly was used as a hunting shack.

Their house on High Island, TX was destroyed by Hurricane Rita and just as reconstruction was started Hurricane Humberto destroyed it again. They had no insurance and did not receive FEMA assistance after Humberto because the house was unfinished when it was destroyed for the second time. They also lost all the personal possessions they had been able to salvage after Rita struck.

They are in case management and schedule for a rebuild by two faith-based organizations in June or July of 2008. Until that time they need assistance to buy/get a larger newer trailer with a lower level bed and water hook ups. They currently live without running water and the old trailer has an upper bed which is very difficult for them to get into. Plus a different unit could be placed on their property allowing them good access for clean up and protection. They are now living about 30 miles away.

After discussions with Connie, my suggestion is that we attempt to locate a larger trailer which can simply be donated to them. I suspect that they live very much on the edge.

Let's partner together to see if we can't help these folks out. They are in case management but do not qualify for a FEMA trailer in High Island.

U.S. Army Troops in need of Helmet Liners

"Support Our Troops" of Christ Lutheran Church in Orland Park, IL, is a loving and

dedicated group of hardworking women who knit and crochet helmet liners, scarves, gators, and neck coolers for U. S. Soldiers deployed in Iraq. The standard items provided by the U. S. Armed Forces are not made of 100% wool and are not as comfortable as what they make for them. The climate in various parts of Iraq can be quite cold or brutally hot depending on the season or where the troops are stationed. With each garment they include the written message



"God be with you and may this keep you warm (cool) and safe until you return."

Over the last several years almost **3,500** handmade items taking from 1-10 hours each to make, have been sent to our troops in Iraq. About 80 women, ages ranging from 20's well into their 70's, from all over the Chicagoland area have been working tirelessly at home and in regular "Bee" meetings.

"Support Our Troops" recently received a request from a U.S. Army Chaplin for helmet liners for each of the soldiers in his unit of **17,000!**

We've had an amazing time here. It's hard to put into words. This past week has been a bit slower paced then the week that the team was here but we're making progress on wrapping up all of our projects. Linda the director for Kids Alive Kenya is coming out tomorrow afternoon and staying thru Tuesday morning which will give us an opportunity to meet and discuss the good and the challenges from this trip and also talk about the short and long term things we see for this ministry and if we fit into that.

The girls are looking forward to getting home (look out McDonalds! here we come!) and seeing the grand parents and all of their friends. The plane rides and lay over in London will be longer coming back but what are you going to do. but take it one step at a time.
