Seven teachers and 17 students from the Christian Academy went to Hermano Pedro Hospital in Antigua, Guatemala last Saturday. This was a voluntary service project. The students held some of the children and wheeled them around in their wheelchairs or walked with them. Most of the patients in this hospital have cerebral palsy because of the poor prenatal care of the mothers. Some of the children were abandoned by their parents and left at the hospital. The students and teachers from CAG enjoyed the morning with the patients and some became attached to them in the short time we were there.
